LETTER OF INTENT

The provision of letters to the activity entity is contingent on the activities' status and its alignment with the regulatory procedures of the country authorities issuing the letters.

The letter of intent is issued to a Participant who has proposed a mitigation activity, confirming that the activity aligns with the NDC of the host country. It affirms the availability of support for participants in A6.2 cooperative approaches and assures oversight to the instrumentalization process. The subsequent step, according to the host country's Article 6 procedures, will be applied to the participant.

1. The [competent authority] takes notes of the [Mitigation Idea Note (MAIN) or other documents required by the country's authority] on [Name of Mitigation Activity] initiative by the [Mitigation Activity developer]. 4. Furthermore, note that the [competent auhtority] has the mandate, as the designated national body, to oversee the technical arrangement of the carbon market instruments under Article 6.2 of the Paris Agreement.

5. Note that should the [Mitigation Activity developer] decide to proceed to the next stage of preparing the Mitigation Activity Design Document (MADD), you will be requested to open a registry account and obtain Mitigation Activity Identification creation of a MAP account and MID for the proposed [Name of mitigation activity] on the registry.
